a. Divine power for a godly life

2 Pet 1:3

His divine power has given us everything we need for life and godliness through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness. (NIV)

b. The divine nature of Christ in us

Col 1:27

To them God has chosen to make known among the Gentiles the glorious riches of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. (NIV)

c. The divine fragrance of his knowledge through us

2 Cor 2:14

But thanks be to God, who always leads us in triumphal procession in Christ and through us spreads everywhere the fragrance of the knowledge of him. (NIV)

God gives us this divine nature in that he might produce his holy life in us to distinguish us from the world.
